ith so many amazing beach destinations around the world, sometimes it's easy to forget the incredible hideaways and stunning locations available right on our doorstep here in the UK. Formed from a variety of islands, peninsulas, bays and headlands, there are huge variety of different terrains around the British coast. With the sun beating down on your back in the height of summer, a chilled glass of white wine in your hand, a coastal break to somewhere on our fair isle may be just what the doctor ordered.

Just a few hours drive away on the north coast of Kent, just off Seasalter beach in Whitstable, sits The Oyster Shell. For a breathtaking getaway, quite literally, on your own island, head to Cornwall. The House in the Sea sits in a magical location right on Towan Beach on the Cornish coast. The only way to The House in the Sea is across a suspension footbridge. Quirky New York style interiors make this retreat the epitome of seaside chic and relaxed luxury. It brings a whole new meaning to 'secluded bliss'.

Another breathtaking Cornish gem is The Viewing Gallery, built on one of the cliffs that overlook the beautiful beach and once busy fishing port of Portreath. It took owner Paul James five years to find the ideal property and eventually he fell in love with it and renovated, creating the impressive building that stands today. With windows that run the entire length of the building, this is the perfect spot to escape to when you crave a seaside break. A
