WHY IT'S ALWAYS PASTRY O'CLOCK

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a canopy of leaves with a treehouse holiday. A whole house with lots of interconnected rooms has been built into a 250-year-old oak tree in the grounds of the Fox and Hounds Hotel in Eggesford, Devon. Treetops is secret and luxurious, with a woodburner, copper bath and - if little ones are in tow - a fabulous children's room with criss-crossed bunks and a ladder of branches. From £245 per night, for two (extra space for children available). Another leafy escape is Old Mill Treehouse, which is just six miles

of Bath. And although there's

no kitchen, breakfast arrives packed into a pienie hamper every morning. From £130 per night (sleeps two). Also near Bath, and with its spacious living area, persian rug and leather armchairs, The Treehouse at Harptree Court is a hotel apartment in the treetops for two and you'll find homemade foodic treats awaiting you. From £250 per night. All these treehouses are available from www.canopyandstars.co.uk

THEY LOVE FOODIES AT The Angel Hut in Shaftsbury, Dorset. If you book a stay in this pretty little private eco cabin on a farm in the heart of Thomas Hardy country, you'll find a gorgeous foodie hamper awaiting you - including bacon, sausages and eggs from the farm, bread made using flour ground at the neighbouring mill and homemade jam and butter. From £90 a night - two night minimum - (www.quirkyaccom.com). For lakeside views and a spot of trout fishing, try The Log Cabin set in a peaceful location by the water's edge on the Blackdown Hills in Devon. From £235 for seven nights (www.quirkyaecom.com). Two

can stay right by the sea at Widemouth Bay in Cornwall in The Beach Hut. Sit on the outside decking, sipping a glass of wine and listening to the sound of sea on sand (www.uniquchomcstays.com). From £1,120 for a three night weekend in low season. Or tuck yourself away in the woods at a fairytale cabin on Dartmoor. The Secret Holt is a perfect romantic hideaway for two, surrounded by ancient trees. It has links to The Hobbit creator J.R.R. Tolkien too, which explains its magical atmosphere (www.uniquehomestays.com). From £620 for a three night weekend in low season.

Dine, and dream on the deck at The Beach Hut (main picture). Back to nature at The Secret Holt (bottom left) or The Log Cabin (bottom right).
