Books by Simonetta Wenkert

Ionathan Franzen Fourth Estate, 570pp

It's ten years since Jonathan Franzen published his epic family saga, The Corrections. At 570 pages long, his new novel, Freedom, is also set within the stifling confines of suburban Minnesotan family life; though this time it is the parents, rather than the children, whose lives occupy centre stage.

Freedom traces the story of Patty and Walter Berglund, encompassing the years of college, young parenthood and the challenges of the empty nest. As typical baby boomers, they wrestle with the freedoms implicit in the book's title sexual, moral, political – which are seen to be the birthright of prosperous liberal America. The choices which the Berglunds and their children make take place in the kind of murky moral no man's land which, at the end of the day, is

the rightful habitat of all great literature. Franzen's speciality as a novelist is to place his already flawed characters in a

series of ambiguous situations (such as the deeply principled ecologist, Walter, ending up by working for a mining company) and allowing them to ultimately find their own moral solutions.

Freedom hums with the sense of what it is to be alive in twenty first century America; the Bush Years, global warming, the sub prime mortgage crisis, yet the personal dramas which take place within the family are no less well depicted. Franzen has a spookily good ear for dialogue, and a deep comic vein runs throughout the novel. In an age of mass-information and woefully shortened attention spans, wallow in the luxury of this slow-moving, yet wonderfully observed, novel.
