Tucked away around the UK are hundreds of quirky holiday destinations just waiting to be discovered. If you're looking for somewhere a bit different that doesn't compromise on comfort then our guide will give you the lowdown.

If you've ever fancied going on a safari, but haven't quite liked the high price tag look no further than the new Livingstone Lodge African Experience at Port Lympne, Kent!

You may be a million miles away from the African Serengeti but you can watch Zebra, Ostrich and Giraffe from the comfort of your own terrace as the sun sets over your tent.

The renowned safari park is run by the Aspinall Foundation, a charity that runs both Port Lympne and Howletts zoo in the UK and overseas conservation projects in countries like the Congo.

Set in 600 acres of land the weekend safari kicks off with a dawn jeep tour around the park where you can watch the Wilderbeast and Rhino waking up and roaming freely. Round off your day with an African style dinner before retreating to your luxury safari tent.

If you are looking for a more relaxed outdoors adventure then hiring a traditional gypsy caravan could be right up your street. Gypsy Caravan holiday breaks have a traditional caravan tucked away in a cider orchard at the end of a quiet lane in Somerset.

Surrounded by the rolling Somerset hills the mystical town of Glastonbury is just a few miles up the road.

If you relish being outdoors but want a little more luxury how about staying in a tree house? You'll find the tree house at Castle Cottage, West Sussex built into a sweet chestnut tree on the edge of a wood. The thatched double room is nestled amongst the trees with large glass doors opening out onto a sweeping balcony.

This sumptuous tree house B&B is perfect for a romantic break – but if you want to take the whole family then the self-catering all mod-cons tree house at Kinlochlaich House in Argyll, Scotland would be perfect.

For a quirky self-catering holiday The Limit, in Holywell Bay, Cornwall is an offbeat 1930's beach hut on the North Cornwall coast. The Limit has two beach huts, one for sleeping and the other for cooking and socialising.

Set in two acres of grounds the beach hut is flanked by a wild garden and giant rhubarb. Perfectly located for a surfing break - or just to relax by the coast.

Grab a board, hang up the 'gone surfing' sign and head to the beach.
